A new spectacular figurine of Jack Skellington will be released to the public on October 22, 2005 during a special Event at the Disneyland® Resort in California.

This innovative and complex sculpture has been made by Kent Melton and is the most complex sculpture ever created by WDCC.

Doug Hild, known for his sculpture of Boo's Door Station, has made the molds and castings of this exquisite piece. Initially, after determination of the various fragile points, the clay piece was cut into 35 pieces and these pieces were used to create the various molds and castings. The figurine contains about 80 mixed media components (metals (like brass, bronze and pewter), resin, leather and of course porcelain). It takes days just to create one single sculpture. The piece measures 20 cm (height), 45,5 cm (length) and 8,25 cm (width).

Jack will be released in a numbered limited edition of 500 figurines and will cost \$499,-.

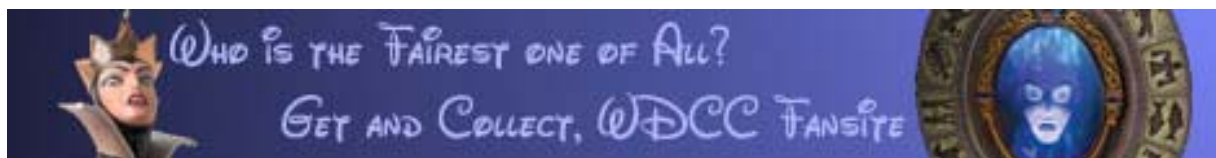
WDCC at the Smithsonian Institute

The American History Museum (better known as the Smithsonian Institute) has a special Disney exhibition from June 5th until September 5th titled "Disneyland: the first 50 years".

The Walt Disney Classics Collection has been honoured, because the Institute will display two scenes of figurines: *Alice and the Caterpillar* ("Who R U?" and "Properly Polite") and *Dumbo, Timothy Mouse and Mr. J. Crow* ("Trust Timothy", "A Magic Feather" and "Fixin' to Help You").
